Prof Kesavan is an outstanding clinician leader who introduced the practice of holistic medicine and health and wellness coaching to improve patient care in NUH. He has also pioneered a personal coaching program for undergraduates in the NUS Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine. His research in bladder cancer assisted in important discoveries in tumour immunology, cytokine-gene therapy and metabolomic analysis and diagnostics in this field. He has contributed to the medical profession through the development of the surgery syllabus and methods of examination in both undergraduate and graduate levels and has held key positions in national and international surgical and urological associations and served in a number of advisory committees of national regulatory bodies.
