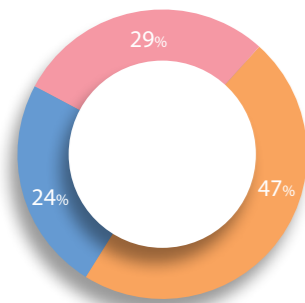

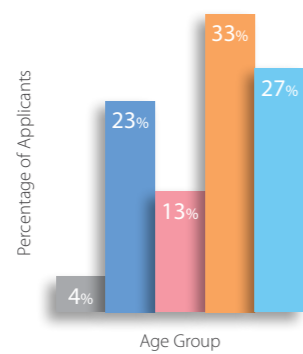

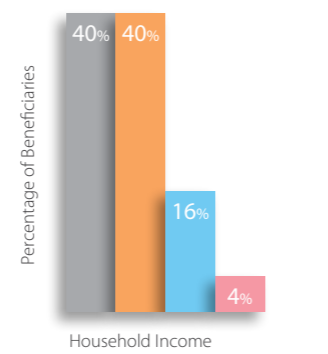
BY AGE GROUP

BY PER CAPITA INCOME

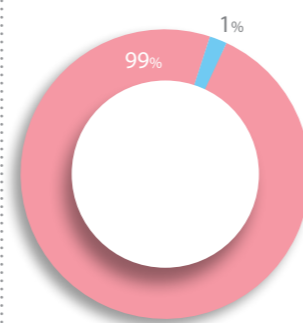

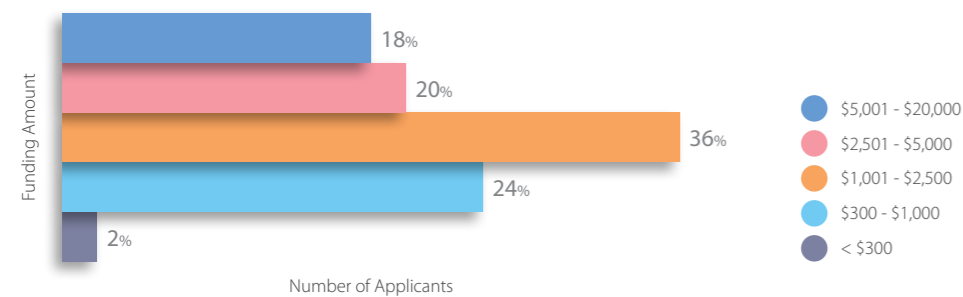

• In order to help as many patients as funds allow, the cap for financial assistance is currently set at \$20,000.

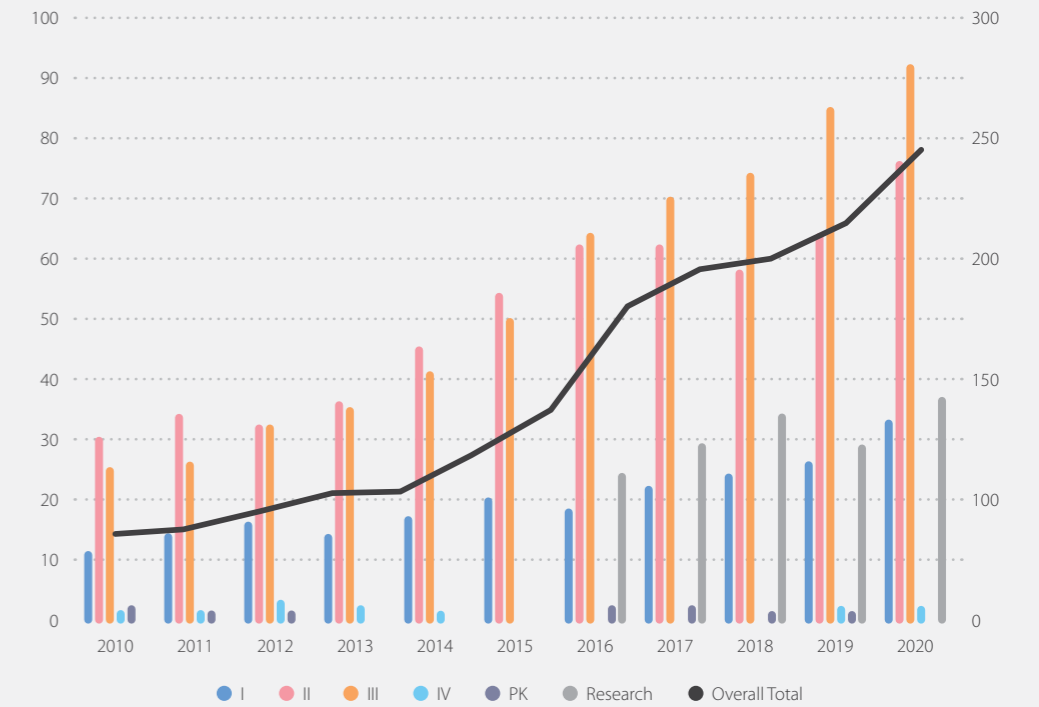

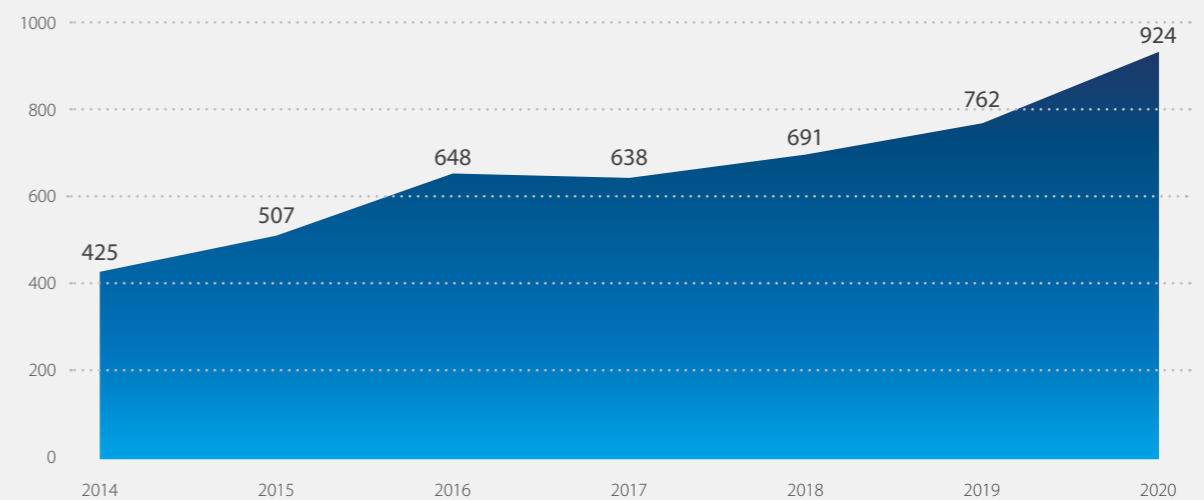

NCIS CELEBRATES LIFE 2021 – UNITED IN HOPE

2020 has been a challenging year for all. It is exceptionally important that we focus on taking care of the well-being of our cancer survivors as we move into 2021. As part of our efforts in fulfilling the emotional and psychological needs of cancer survivors at NCIS, our annual event, NCIS Celebrates Life was held on 23 January 2021.

For the first time since its conceptualisation, the event was conducted virtually through a Zoom Webinar platform. During the virtual event, cancer patients, survivors and caregivers from all walks of life were invited to come together to celebrate life after cancer and to reinvigorate hope. This year, the theme was “United in Hope”, to symbolise our survivors’ and caregivers’ community spirit and togetherness in overcoming the cancer journey through collective courage and strength.

The programme was specially created by our cancer survivors for survivors. It included a sharing session by survivor and NCIS patient, Mr Hilman Basri. Mr Hilman shared the obstacles and challenges faced during treatment and how he overcame them. His positive mindset and a passion to live life to the fullest and chase after his dreams despite his cancer diagnosis motivated and inspired the participants. We also showcased our patient support groups and had a sharing from the OneHeart Support Group lead.

During the event, Mr Mohamed Shariff, a cancer survivor and chef with 40 years of experience and NUH Dietitian, Ms Lynn Teong shared nutritional tips while showing our viewers a healthy and delicious recipe of chicken paillard and oregano pesto penne paired with a mixed salad of cherry tomatoes and grapes.

As most cancer survivors experience changes in their everyday life such as pain, fatigue, numbness and difficulty in performing basic daily activities, the segment on cancer rehabilitation showed how it can help survivors address these problems and improve their quality of life. Associate Consultant in NUH Rehabilitation Medicine, Dr Jong Sze Chin, Advanced Practice Nurse in NCIS Oncology Nursing, Miss Carol Ho and cancer survivor, Mdm Chua Bong Chee discussed the benefits of cancer rehabilitation and our partnerships with the community in cancer rehabilitation. In addition, NUH Physiotherapist, Ms Danae Chiong shared the benefits of staying active during and after treatment by providing our participants with exercise tips that can be incorporated into their daily routine.

Some of the encouraging feedback received from our participants include:

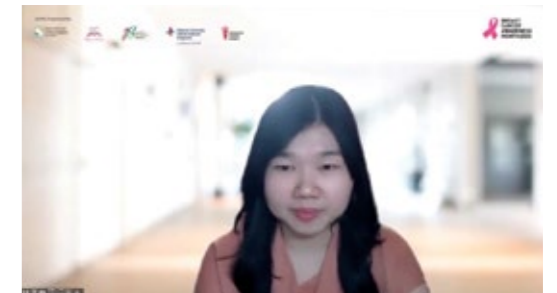
Thank you very much for organising this forum. It was very meaningful and a very good platform for sharing and learning. Love the online version as it is more convenient for me to join the forum.
